## General information for Jacobs University visitors: www.jacobs-university.de/visit

Bremen can be reached conveniently by train and the hotel and restaurants will be within easy reach of Bremen Central Station (Hauptbahnhof). Bremen Airport is small but has regular services from European hubs. The airport is a 10-15-minute taxi or tram (Line 6) ride away from the Central Station. Hamburg Airport is about 1.5 hours by train from Bremen.

Best Western "Hotel zur Post" is close to Bremen Central Station and convenient for the trips to Jacobs University, dinners in the evening and general arrival/departure by plane or train.
